

McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

IMPORTANT RIGHTS TO REMEMBER:

Immediate Enrollment

Schools must enroll children immediately even if they lack normally required documents, such as immunization records or proof of residence.

Transportation

Transportation to and from school and extracurriculars free of charge, which may include gas gift-cards or mileage reimbursement. This includes ensuring specific busing for homeless students so they can stay at the school they were attending before they became homeless.

School Selection

Students experiencing homelessness have the right to attend their school of origin (the school they attended when they first became homeless) even if they are not residing in the area anymore if it's in the best interest of the student.

Eliminate Other Barriers to Full Participation

- Academic support
- Free and reduced lunch
- Fee waivers for technology and extracurricular activities
- Access to Title 1, Part A funds to support success in school, which may include clothing, immunizations, food, medical services, counseling services, etc.

MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT Information

Definition: Homeless children and youths as individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.

This definition includes (but is not limited to) children & youths who are:

- Sharing housing due to loss of housing, economic hardship or a similiar event (e.g. doubled-up)
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or campgrounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- Abandoned in hospitals
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters
- Sleeping in places unfit for human habitation (e.g. cars, parks, public spaces, abadnoned buildings, substandard housing, or similar settings)

RESOURCE PANTRY
